## Tjapukai cultural park upgrade reveals more near Cairns

CONFERENCES are now being held at the \$12 million Tjapukai Aboriginal Cultural Park as more of its redevelopment is completed.

The new Bundarra Cassowary Egg Theatre at Caravonica will host the first event next month, followed by the Canopy Breezeway later in the year.

Sales executive Saskia Wrobluskie said the park had long been a favourite gala dinner venue for conference and incentive groups, but now was more versatile for the business events industry.

“The inaugural conference to be held in the Bundarra Cassowary Egg Theatre in March will be a professional development training day for health and community workers,” she said.

“Taking its name from the Djabugay word for cassowary, the theatre is a shaped like a cassowary egg as the bundarra is central to many of the stories of the Djabugay rainforest people who are the local traditional owners.”

Ms Wrobluskie said the new venues added a greater dimension to the event capabilities of Tjapukai Aboriginal Cultural Park, which includes unique indoor and outdoor venues.
